### Mobile Register Supplement:

On 5 November 1999, the MMA's "FINE Lines" publication was included as a supplement in the Mobile Register. The MMA asked us to contribute a "brief" article about our organization in connection with the announcement for our fall show

at the downtown gallery. Below is that article, slightly edited by the museum, in case anyone missed it. This was an outstanding opportunity for us to gain some publicity since this supplement was sent to nearly ten times the number of readers to which the MMA sends!

### "Watercolor and Graphic Arts Society Plan Exhibition

The Fall Show of the Watercolor and Graphic Arts Society of Mobile will be held at the MMA downtown gallery from December 4, 1999, through January 2, 2000. This year Jere Allen will serve as juror for the show. Mr. Allen is an internationally known artist, and professor of painting and drawing at the University of Mississippi.

This year marks the 51st anniversary of the Society, probably the oldest arts organization in Mobile. The Society was an outgrowth of the Bayou Painters group. It began on June 5, 1948, as simply the "Watercolor Society of Mobile", and was then open to Alabama artists only. There were originally 22 members including Genevieve Southerland, Edmond deCelle, and Bea Tucker, who is the sole surviving charter member. William Bush served as the first president. Many well-known and well-respected artists have been members since then. Records indicate that "and Graphic Arts" was added in 1954. Today there are 90 members, and the current president is Allan Butt.

It is not easy to become a member in the Society. Two active members must nominate possible members in writing at the fall meeting. Then the nominees are formally invited to join and asked to submit a résumé. The prospective members must each show two or three (depending on space) pieces in the Society's Spring Show. A secret committee of current members, appointed by the president, then chooses the new members. Those who are not chosen are welcome to reapply the next year."
